In 2010, advanced development program will be organized and outline is same as below. Details will be confirmed by the new development committee, and it will be informed to all of AAF member association after the development committee meeting in January.

- ▶ **Supporting Equipments:** 3 Member associations will be appointed.
- ▶ **Technical Assistance:** 3 Member associations will be appointed, and dispatching term of the technical coach will be extended to one month.
- ▶ **Seminar & Organizing Workshop:** The dates and venue will be confirmed.
- ▶ **Regional Training Center:** Regional training center will be managed, and it will help archers from neighbored countries to gather and train.
